## McKenna Foundation Grants Aim to Improve Community Well-Being

NEW BRAUNFELS, TX (June 4, 2012) – The McKenna Foundation recently committed nearly \$1 million to improve the health and well-being for residents of New Braunfels and Comal County. Grant allocations included \$135,000 as seed funding to create the New Braunfels Area Community Foundation, \$95,000 toward development of a transitional housing facility for homeless families and \$731,675 to 28 local nonprofit organizations whose missions target those with the highest needs in Comal County.

According to Wes Studdard, Chairman of the McKenna Board of Trustees, the needs of the most vulnerable in our community take precedent when allocating grant funds. "We are in our fourth year of grant making and feel we get to know the community better every year. There are many diverse needs out there and fortunately, there are also high functioning organizations operating solely to meet those needs. McKenna will continue to partner with organizations dedicated to providing the resources necessary to make well-being affordable and accessible to everyone."

The idea for the New Braunfels Area Community Foundation has been spearheaded by a group of community volunteers and modeled after successful community foundations across the state. As a public charity, the New Braunfels Area Community Foundation will promote philanthropy by creating opportunities for individuals to endow educational scholarships, field of interest funds, designated funds and donor advised funds for the benefit of nonprofit organizations in our community.

The McKenna Board also awarded funds to develop the first transitional living facility for homeless families in Comal County. With the number of homeless single and two-parent families with children increasing each year, the Board recognized the need to provide a housing resource where eligible families can set attainable goals, gain financial stability and transition into permanent

housing. This project will be a collaboration between McKenna, local nonprofit organizations, churches and individuals.
